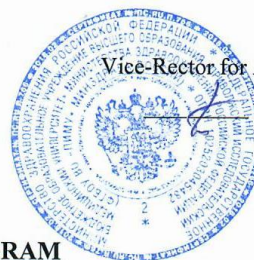

1. The purpose and objectives of mastering the academic discipline “Law” (hereinafter – the discipline):

1.1. The purpose of mastering the discipline: (*participation in forming the relevant competencies*):

1. aptitude for intolerable attitude towards corrupt conduct (UC-10);
