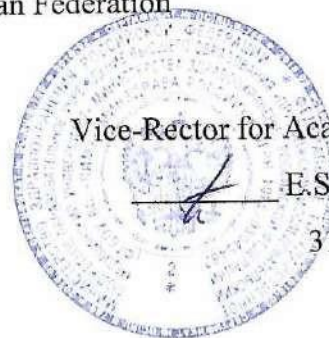



1. The purpose and objectives of mastering the academic discipline “Law” (hereinafter – the discipline):

1.1. The purpose of mastering the discipline: (*participation in forming the relevant competencies*):

1. aptitude for critical analysis of problematic situations based on systematic approach; ability to strategize (UC-1);
2. aptitude for intolerable attitude towards corrupt conduct (UC-11);
3. aptitude for following moral and legal norms, ethical and deontological principles in the professional activities (GPC-1);
4. aptitude for preparing and implementing of normative documentation in the health care system (GPC-11)

1.2. Requirements to the deliverables of mastering the discipline

As a result of completing the discipline, the student should

Know:

- General principals and provisions of constitutional, administrative, penal, civil, employment, family and medical law of Russian Federation;
- Moral and ethical norms, rules and principals of professional medical treatment behaviour, rights of patients and medical workers as well, essential ethical standards of international and national medical associations and organizations;
- Basics of the legislation of Russian Federation, essential normative legal acts and subordinate legislation regulating health care of children and adult population.

Be able to:

- Make legally valid decisions independently if situation so requires while performing professional medical activities;
- Execute service records according to legal requirements;
- Be versed in current normative legal acts regulating labour relations especially those concerning women and children; follow the rules of labour law if the case requires it;
- Support and protect the rights of variously-aged patients and legal interests and rights of medical workers as well.

Possess:

- Skills of legal thinking, research, study, analysis and interpretation of normative legal acts regulating medical activity;
- Skills of informing variously-aged patients and their legal representatives about further medical interventions according to the federal legislation about getting voluntary informed consent to medical services;
- Skills of legal evaluation of their own actions in certain situations of professional medical activity for making optimal legally valid decisions;
- Skills of legal evaluation of cases of medical service failure as well as other infractions of law, and offences related to professional activity and its consequences;
- Skills of using normative legal documents and research of necessary legal information.

2.1. The discipline “Law” refers to the core part (*or the part formed by the participants of educational relations*) of Block 1 of GEP HE (Academic discipline index).
